# **COVID-19 Update for parents**

Following the Government's implementation of 'Step 4' there has been a move away from the stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people on how to protect themselves and others.

At Violet Way Academy, we are following the Schools' Covid Operational Guidance, which has been informed by the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and Public Health England (PHE). The Government has advised that, as COVID-19 becomes a virus that we learn to live with, there is now an imperative to reduce the disruption to children and young people's education - particularly given that the direct clinical risks to children are extremely low, and every adult has been offered a first vaccine and the opportunity for two doses by mid-September.

Our priority is to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils. The evidence is clear that being out of education causes significant harm to educational attainment, life chances, mental and physical health.

We have completed a comprehensive Covid risk assessment and an outbreak management plan (in the event of a localised outbreak) and continue to ensure staff and pupils follow good hygiene routines, washing their hands regularly with soap and water and/or hand sanitiser.

The NHS states that the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are: a high temperature a new, continuous cough a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

If your child has any of these symptoms, they will need to self-isolate and get a PCR test - please keep school informed. Track and trace are responsible for all contact tracing and advising next steps. You should follow public health advice. The self-isolation rules have changed. If someone you live with has had symptoms, or you are a close contact of someone with symptoms, you <u>do not</u> need to self-isolate if any of the following apply:

- ✓ you're fully vaccinated this means 14 days have passed since your final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS
- ✓ you're under 18 years, 6 months old
- $\checkmark$  you're taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial
- ✓ you're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

If any children must self-isolate, they will be provided with remote learning, if they are well enough.

# **Coffee and Cake Afternoon**


