
A Message from Mrs Kee

A warm welcome back after the holiday to all our families. I hope you had a lovely half term holiday. Apologies that I was unable to be on the gate on the first morning and Friday this week. Unfortunately, I had to attend the hospital for appointments that could not be arranged out of school time.

The first week back after the half term holiday has been busy and I have enjoyed visiting all the classes across school to observe the learning in action. This week I have had the pleasure of watching children in Reception during their PE lesson and was impressed with how well they were moving around the hall, developing their jumping and hopping skills. The children in Year 1 were using their phonic knowledge to write words with 'Set 2' sounds. One child showed me the word queen and excitedly told me how she had remembered to write the 'ee' sound! In Year 2, I was fortunate enough to teach two PE lessons this week with a focus on learning the correct technique when jumping and hopping forward and diagonally over cones. The children watched each other closely, identifying when

good technique, such as bending the knees, was used. This week, we have sent out a letter about parking and our new 'Parking Buddies' will be making their debut appearance next week! Walking is great exercise and good for our well-being. Please walk to school as many days as you can and, if you have to drive, please park away from the school and then walk the rest of the way.

For those families celebrating Diwali and Bonfire night this week, I hope you have a wonderful time. Remember to wrap up warm and stay safe. 








Happy Diwali

What is Bonfire Night?

On 5 November, people across the UK celebrate Bonfire Night with fireworks, bonfires, sparklers and toffee apples. It's the anniversary of a failed attempt to blow up the Houses of Parliament, which was called the Gunpowder Plot. When we light bonfires to remember this event, traditionally there would be a dummy man on the top. It is called the 'Guy' and represents a man who was part of the plot, called Guy Fawkes.

Flu immunisations

The Flu Immunisation Team will soon be coming to Violet Way for our whole school children's nasal spray flu immunisations on Wednesday 1st December. In advance of this, they require parents to fill out a consent form. Unfortunately, we have been informed that the link and code they have provided us with are not working. Miss Evans in contacting them to get a link that works and will share that with you as soon as possible. The deadline for completing the form will be 9:00am on 29th November 2021.

This vaccination is delivered by a nasal spray and recommended to help protect your child against flu. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. With COVID-19 still in circulation, it is important to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them, the NHS and social care. This vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year. Reading Rewards

Reading at home enables children to practice their phonics, blending the sounds together to read each word, develop fluency, expression and comprehension and just enjoy reading for the pleasure it brings. Often parents can worry that their child has read their home reading book and should read another, but research shows that rereading the same books over and over again supports the development of children's reading fluency. At Violet Way, we have a reading reward system in place, linked to the number of times children read at home. Parents complete the reading log / reading diary for their child on Marvellous Me and there are prizes for three stages (see opposite).

Below are some ideas of writing your child might enjoy doing at home:

- ✓ Use your phonic knowledge to write the correct letter formation or words
- ✓ Write your name
- ✓ Write a shopping list or a list to Santa
- Write a birthday card, Diwali card,
 Christmas card, Eid card to someone
- ✓ Write labels for a picture
- Draw a picture and write a sentence next to it
- ✓ Write a postcard
- Write some fun facts about something you have been learning
- ✓ Write a letter
- ✓ Write an email
- Write instructions how to make something
- ✓ Write a recipe
- ✓ Write a story
- ✓ Writing doesn't have to be on paper it can be outside in sand, with chalk, water, flour, foam or playdoh to write and make letters too!
