

Covid-19 Update

Information about daily Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing was shared this week with all parents. From Tuesday 14 December, people who are fully vaccinated and identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an NHS rapid lateral flow test every day for 7 days to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

Daily rapid testing applies to all contacts who are:

- fully vaccinated adults – people who have had 2 jabs
- all children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, regardless of their vaccination status
- people who can prove they are unable to be vaccinated for clinical reasons
- people taking part, or have taken part, in an approved clinical trial for a COVID-19 vaccine

Under 5s are exempt from self-isolation and do not need to take part in daily rapid lateral flow testing. Smoking

At Violet Way Academy, we value the health and welfare of all within our community as a key priority. We believe that a healthy and safe environment is important in terms of physical well-being and is also a vital factor in promoting positive emotional health. It is important to us, that our policy and approach to smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (vaping) should reflect changing social attitudes, and actively reflect and support our goals for effective and lasting drugs education.

Our no-smoking policy clearly applies to the school building and site, but we are also aware of children walking to school that may be passing through smoke each day on the way to school if parents are smoking outside the school gates and the entrance to the school site. We are concerned about the health issues that second-hand smoke might cause. While second-hand smoke - which is when you breathe in smoke from cigarettes, but don't smoke directly - is not nearly as dangerous as smoking itself, it can still be damaging to breathe in, in a similar way to pollution. Also, if parents and carers aren't smoking outside school gates, it sets a positive example to our children and young people. By stopping smoking near school gates, it helps to make smoking invisible to children and reduces their chance of trying it for themselves. We hope all parents will support us with this aim.





Reminders for the New Year

VIOLET WAY UNIFORM

We believe it is important for children to wear school uniform because it looks smart, wears well and fosters a sense of belonging and pride. Our school uniform consists of:

- ✓ Violet Way polo shirt
- ✓ Violet Way cardigan or jumper
- ✓ Grey skirt, shorts, trousers
- ✓ Grey dress or violet check summer dress
- ✓ Black shoes



ALL children's clothing and footwear **MUST** be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Our PE uniform consists of:

- ✓ Violet Way polo shirt and shorts
- ✓ Black pumps

All PE should be kept in a drawstring bag clearly labelled with your child's name.

All children should have a pair of wellies, labelled with their name, to keep in school for Forest School. On your child's Forest School day, they need to wear their school uniform top and jumper or cardigan with long trousers, leggings or joggers.

Jewellery should not be worn, other than small stud earrings (if children have pierced ears) and a watch. Children should not wear nail varnish to school.

SNACKS

Please ensure that only healthy snacks are sent into school. Chocolate and crisps should **NOT** be brought into school for snacks – these should be saved for home. In school, suitable snacks are pieces of fruit, vegetable sticks, bread sticks, crackers, malt loaf, cereal bars (NO nuts or sugary/chocolate bars), string cheese, yogurt tube, rice cakes.

SPRING TERM

We have a Trust INSET day on Tuesday 4th January. Children return to school in the New Year on Wednesday 5th January.





Attendance

Parents received their child's attendance summary for the term this week. Please be aware that the sessions are am/pm so 10 sessions would be equal to 5 days absence. We have to use Government coding and, although children have to isolate if they have Covid, this is recorded as absence using the Government coding system. Covid does impact on attendance and so we all need to ensure that children are attending school everyday when they are well. There is a strong negative link between absence and attainment so good attendance is really important. Thank you to parents that have ensured that children continue to complete their learning remote where necessary. Currently as a school our overall attendance for the term is 91.43%. which is actually better than the current national average. Thank you to parents for working with us as a school to follow guidance and keep Covid rates as low as possible.

Swimming in Year 1

Ladybirds will be going swimming this term (a letter will be sent out to the Ladybirds class in the first week back with the details). The swimming lessons will be on Tuesdays and the first lesson will be on Tuesday 11th January.
