


Please read the information below carefully as each year group has a different plan and times. Thank you.

Reception:

When? We will be walking down to Holly Green with parents and parading May poles at Holly Green. Parents to meet outside the green gates at 1.40pm.

Toddler Group

Toddler Group – Starting back on Tuesday 3rd May! (every Tuesday 9:00am-10:30am, £2 per family)

We are planning to start our Parent and Toddler session on Tuesday mornings for parents with pre-school children. These ran very successfully last academic year, prior to the Covid disruption. Mrs Kee has confirmed with Mrs Jo Smith, who runs the sessions, that the sessions can now restart.



The sessions will run 9:00am-10:30am every Tuesday at a cost of \pounds 2.00 per family. The first session will be on Tuesday 3rd May 2022. Please go to the side entrance by the steps (adjacent to the sports court). The catering team will supply a plate of fruit and juice for the children and there will be hot drinks and toast available for purchase.

Kids eat free in the M&S Cafe if you spend £5. One free children's meal per transaction. Between 4th April and 22nd April.

MORRISONS

Kids eat free all day, every day in Morrisons cafes nationwide with one paying adult. Plus they have the feed the family for £10 deal running at Easter

YO! SUSHI

Pick any main, a side of edamame beans and drink and you'll get it free with a £10 adult spend throughout half term.

ASDA

Kids eat free in Asda's cafes after 3pm Monday - Friday.

GORDON RAMSAY RESTAURANTS

Kids under 12 eat FREE all day, every day at selected Gordon Ramsay restaurants.

BELLA ITALIA

Children can eat for £1 with any adult main. The offer is valid from 1st April - 24th April 2022

Kids eat FREE every Sunday for every £10 spent by an adult.

DUNELM CAFE-PAUSA

Kids eat FREE when adults spend just £4 or more at Pausa cafes which you will inside Dunelm stores.

PRETO

Kids under 12 eat FREE all day, every day at selected Gordon Ramsay restaurants.

HUNGRY HORSE

Kids eat breakfast free when accompanied by a paying adult, all day every day through the Easter holidays from 9am - 12pm.

FARMHOUSE INNS

From 4th – 22nd April, Monday to Friday, up to two kids per paying adult can eat for just $\pounds I$ each



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Energy Saving

Some tips for saving energy and saving money!

Turn off standby appliances –Save up to £30.00 yr. Turn appliances off at the plug

Install a smart thermostat – Save up to £75.00 yr. Make your heating more efficient by only warming the rooms you are using.

Turn down your thermostat- Save up to £80.00 yr. Turning your heating down by just one degree could save



Buy efficient appliances- Save up to £300.00 yr.

Wash clothes at a lower temperature – Save up to ± 10.00 yr. Washing at 30 degrees rather than 40 degrees can help, if you can cut out one wash cycle per week you'll clip ± 5 off your annual energy bill.

Be smarter about water – Save up to ± 10.00 yr. You can save around ± 25 a year by washing up in a bowl rather than using a running tap. Buying a more efficient shower head can save you as much as ± 18 per person a year on energy bills, plus an additional amount if you have a water meter.

Draught-proof your property – Save up to ± 35.00 yr.

A cold draught can cause your home to lose heat, which makes it more tempting to turn the heating up. Draught excluders or draught-proofing kits are a good way to prevent this. Seal cracks in floors and skirting boards line your letterbox and block an unused chimney to reduce your heating bills by up to ± 35 a year.

Monitor your usage - check and supply readings no more estimates

Keeping a watchful eye on your consumption levels can help you decide if and when you have to change the way you use energy. Installing a Smart Meter lets you track your consumption with accurate and real time information.
