Register for free to access.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read a variety of books at home. Favourites can be repeated. Hearing the patterns of language in a story will support your child's language development. Children to read to parents daily. Read Oxford Owl eBooks and complete the linked Play activities for each book. With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for the tricky words they are currently learning. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers. Practice words and sounds in your reading diary.
