Daily routines

Some parents have asked for suggestions on how to help their child learn at home. Each family may decide to carry out activities in a way that best suits them and their circumstances such as fitting around their own work.

For those wanting to follow more of a structured day you may want to consider:

Morning	
Physical exercise/ wake up shake up	Join an online fitness group such as the Joe Wicks work out (every day at 9am) or other physical activity.
Phonics Time	10 – 15 minutes. Practising letter sounds. You can watch or play an activity on line or make flash cards.
Writing	Practise letter formation and carry out one of the suggested activities for your child.
Break time	
Maths	Carry out an activity or play game related to the maths focus.
Lunch	
Reading (about 20 mins)	
creative/ topic based	Fun creative / topic based learning.
