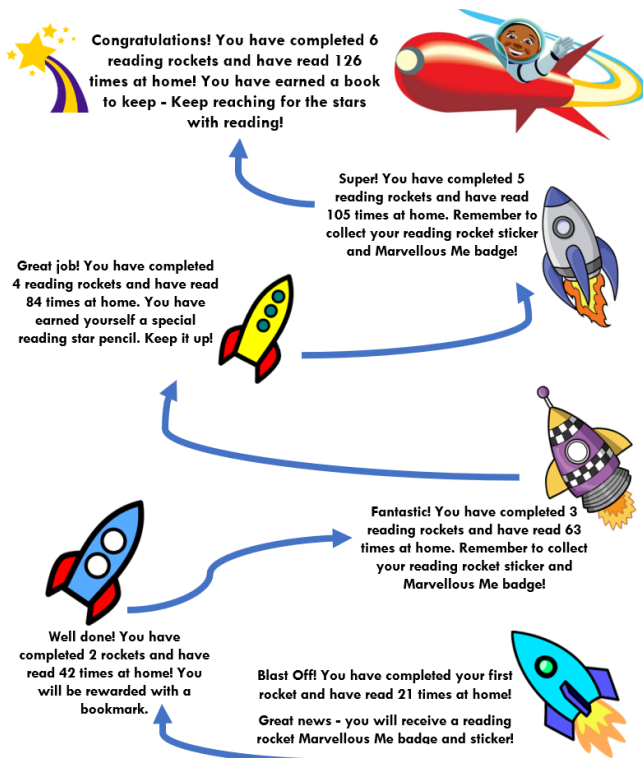

## Attendance Matters

At the end of the Autumn Term, we congratulated all the children that had 96%+ attendance. 142 children across the school received a certificate! We also had 60 children who had 100% attendance in the Autumn Term, and this was also celebrated. All parents will have received a letter about their child's attendance in the Autumn Term. The information below illustrates the impact of lost learning over an academic year:

### **Attendance record and lessons missed\***

95% attendance means a child missed about 10 days or 2 weeks of lessons in the school year.

90% attendance means a child misses four weeks of lessons in the school year.

85% attendance means the child misses almost 6 weeks of lessons in the school year

80% attendance means the child misses over 7 weeks of lessons in the school year

### **Punctuality\***

Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year!

\*Please note, these calculations are approximate, based on how the terms fall each calendar year.







## Children's Eye Health

**Eye appointments for children are FREE!** If you haven't done so already, it would be worth booking your child in for an eye test at the optician. In school, we will always inform parents if their child appears to be struggling to read from the Interactive Whiteboard, or is experiencing headaches or other signs, which could indicate they can't see clearly. It is important to seek advice from your GP or visit an optician if you have any concerns about your child's sight. Children often don't complain about their sight, but they may show signs of not being able to see clearly, such as:

- Sitting close to the TV
- Holding objects very close to their face
- Blinking a lot
- Rubbing their eyes

Children should have regular eye checks at the opticians, even if your child is not showing any of these signs.

Although serious vision problems during childhood are rare, routine eye checks are offered to newborn babies and young children to identify any problems early on.

**Free** NHS sight tests are available at opticians for children under 16 and for young people under 19 in full-time education.

Go to an opticians if you have any concerns about your child's eyes or vision. The earlier a problem is picked up the better.

### **When will my child's eyes be checked?**

Children's eyes are checked a number of times throughout the first hour, weeks and years of their lives. Parents are also asked if they have any concerns about their children's eyesight as part of their child's health and development review around 1 year and between 2-2 and half years. **It is important that children around 4-5 years old are examined for Vision Screening. This can be done by an eye test at any high street optometrist.**
