I was so excited to hear that one of our Y1 children had been so inspired by the book 'Stickman' by Julia Donaldson, that she went for a walk, collected lots of sticks and then creatively designed her very own stickman. Thank you for sharing! We have also had more children sharing their writing at home with Mrs Williams and their work has been added to the board. Keep them coming!

This week I have been talking to the children about reading. As a school, we recognise the importance of listening to pupils in order to inform our decisions. The children were able to talk about their reading books and library books, their favourite stories, their enjoyment of story time in class and their experiences of home reading. They also came up with some great suggestions for improving reading further at VWA, including raising money to buy more books. Reading is so important. In the DfE document [The Reading Framework](#), they identify that "Fluency of reading is also a key indicator for future success in further education, higher education and employment." I support this view and, when I started at Violet Way, I immediately recognised that the library needed a complete revamp. After trying to source funding, the PTA have happily agreed to support the project. The room has now been painted (thanks Mr Bill!) and the order has been placed for shelving. Watch this space! ## Covid Update

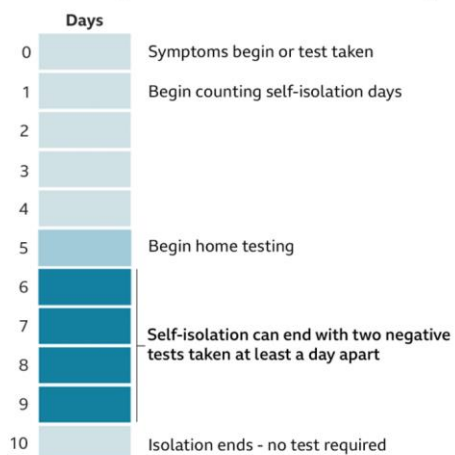
We have had a few cases of Covid in school and have asked any close contacts to LFD test daily, in line with Government guidance. As a result of us sending letters to parents requesting that they carry out LFD tests with children in close contact with a confirmed case, we have had a few more confirmed cases. Mrs Kee continues to communicate regularly with the Local Authority, who have informed us that this is to be expected because there will be children that do not present with symptoms. We currently have a few positive cases in some classes across the school and we continue to monitor the situation daily. There has not, at this point, been a spike in cases and the Local Authority have confirmed that we need to continue with our current measures, which includes:

- good hygiene practices, reviewed with children regularly
- ventilation (keeping windows open slightly to allow air flow)
- good cleaning routines
- systems in place for informing close contacts
- staff continue to LFD twice per week and daily if identified as a close contact
- anyone with symptoms to isolate straight away and get tested
- parental events postponed currently
- educational visitors asked to wear masks
- risk assessment in place

Following advice from the Local Authority, we will not have whole school assemblies in the hall. Children will have their Monday and Friday assemblies in year groups. Mrs Kee continues to regularly review the situation and will keep parents informed.

From Monday 17th January, self-isolation rules are changing again. The diagram opposite explains how it works. You begin isolation the day after symptoms or a positive test. You have to isolate for at least five full days. You can LFD test on day five and day 6 (24 hours apart) and if both tests are negative, you can finish isolating immediately. If the tests are positive days or when you have two negative tests 24 hours apart.

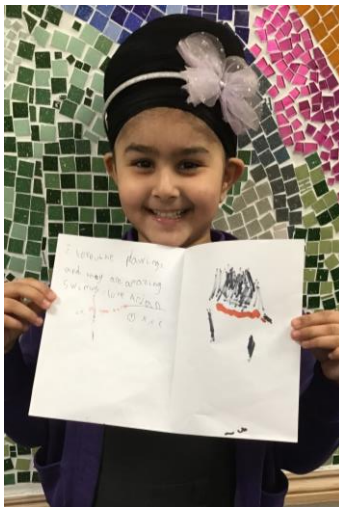
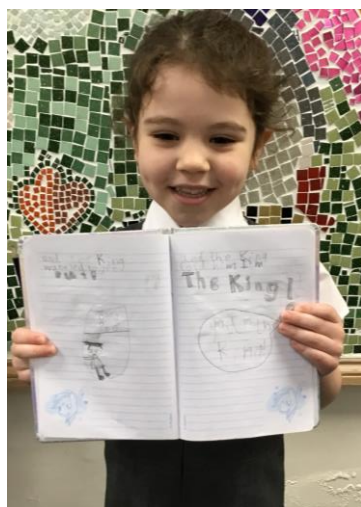
