Reading

- Fluently and without sounding out read first 25 HFW
- Fluent reading of set 1 words and cvc words, cvcc, ccvc
- Able to sound out real and nonsense words with Set 1 and cvc words, cvcc, ccvc
- Fluent and accurate reading of green RWI book (or equivalent)

Writing

- Spell bronze words

- Write a simple sentence with finger spaces.
- To use known sounds to sound out and spell words, including cvc words.
- Think it, say it, write it, check it – able to think of sentences and say them aloud before writing them then checking them back.
- Form most letters correctly

Maths

- Confidently count to and back to 20 from different starting points
- Read and write numbers to 20
- Say 1 more 1 less numbers to 20
- Add and subtract numbers using a range of methods and apparatus – numicon, number lines, tens frames, part whole, base ten
- Fluent at number bonds up to 5 and then 10.

Please could you also complete this and bring back to school on the first day of term for your class teacher. We are looking forward to reading them all.

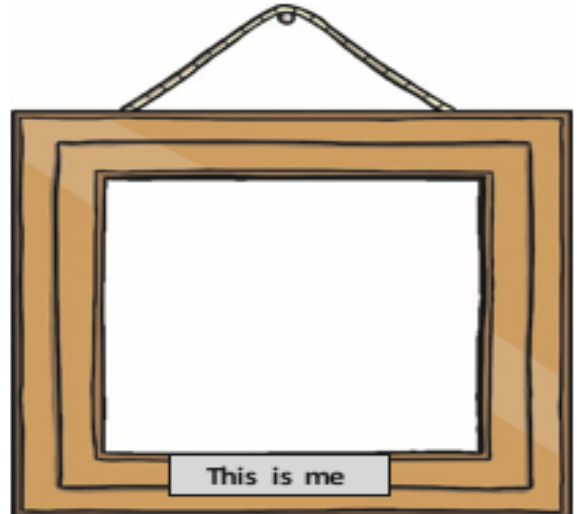
