# My Happy Mind - Feedback so far....

As a school, we launched MyHappyMind across the school at the start of this academic year. We have had some really positive feedback from staff and pupils about the 'Meet your Brain' module:

- 100% of teachers say that Meet Your Brain has helped their class to understand their brain
- 100% of teachers say Happy Breathing has benefitted most children in their class
- 83% of teachers are integrating the language from Meet Your Brain into their teaching and learning

What teachers have said about MyHappyMind programme:

- A child in my class said to me, 'I'm finding this Math's work very tricky, so I am going to do some Happy Breathing to help my brain'.
- ✓ All children have learnt information about their brain.

The programme is clearly already having a positive impact on our pupils at Violet Way.
