Year 1	<ul> <li>Use a sketchbook to explore, experiment and gather artwork</li> <li>Use a variety of drawings tools: pencils, rubbers, crayons, charcoal, felt tips, computer software and other dry media</li> <li>Use pencils to create lines of different thickness</li> <li>Explore shading using pencils</li> <li>Observe and draw landscapes</li> <li>Observe and draw anatomy (faces, limbs)</li> <li>Use a sketchbook to explore and experiment</li> <li>Find collections of colour</li> <li>Use a variety of tools and techniques including the use of different brush sizes and types.</li> <li>Mix and match colours to artefacts and objects.</li> <li>Work on different scales.</li> <li>Know primary colours (red, yellow, blue) and mix together to create secondary colours (orange, purple, green)</li> <li>Explore tints by adding white to paint</li> <li>Explore shades by adding black</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Know how to thread a large-eyed needle</li> <li>Know how to secure a knot and tie off a thread</li> <li>Know how to sew using a simple running stitch</li> <li>Construct with a purpose in mind using a range of materials</li> <li>Create 3D models from imagination, experience or observation</li> <li>Use natural materials to create art (based on the work of Andy Goldsworthy)</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Recognise pattern in the natural world</li> <li>Talk about patterns, repeating patterns and symmetry</li> <li>Create leaf rubbings using crayons</li> <li>Experiment with the amount of paint or ink they use to print (too much paint - blurred print / too little paint - indistinct print)</li> <li>Print with leaves and sponges to create pictures and patterns</li> <li>Create a relief print block to make patterns (arranging string on a card surface)</li> </ul>	
Year 2	<ul> <li>Use a sketchbook to explore, experiment and gather artwork</li> <li>Use a variety of drawings tools: pencils, rubbers, crayons, oil pastels and other dry media</li> <li>Use drawing as a way of recording feelings, moods and experiences</li> <li>Use a viewfinder to focus on a specific part of an artefact before drawing it</li> <li>Sketch to make quick records</li> <li>Discuss use of shadows, use of light and dark</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Know primary colours and mix together to create secondary colours</li> <li>Begin to explore tertiary colour mixing e.g. bluegreen (Teal); yellow-green (Chartreuse); red-orange (Vermilion); red-purple (Magenta); blue-purple (Violet); yellow-orange (Amber)</li> <li>Use a variety of tools and techniques including the use of different brush sizes and types.</li> <li>Create tints by adding white and shades by adding</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Know how to thread a large-eyed needle</li> <li>Know how to secure a knot (when starting) and tie off a thread (when finishing)</li> <li>Use an overstitch to sew two pieces of fabric together</li> <li>Create simple appliqué work (sewing or sticking)</li> <li>Create textured collages from a variety of media</li> <li>Use overlapping and/or overlaying to create effects</li> <li>Use a wide variety of media to create texture for collage: fabric, plastic, tissue, crepe paper, tissue paper, seeds (sunflowers)</li> <li>Express personal experiences and ideas</li> <li>Shape and form using malleable materials (clay)</li> <li>Replicate patterns and textures in a 3-D form</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Notice regular and irregular patterns in art</li> <li>Compare natural and man-made patterns</li> <li>Design patterns of increasing complexity and repetition (regular and irregular)</li> <li>Recognise art produced using printing techniques</li> <li>Develop own impressed images using clay (negative print)</li> </ul>
